NEW SOUTH WALES ANNUAL BIRD REPORT 1999

The thirtieth Annual Bird Report covers the period 1 January to 31 December 1999 and summarises the more significant observations of birds during that year.

The main aims of the NSW Bird Report continue to be:

To record reported observations of species accidental or rare to NSW;

To record observations which more precisely define the normal distributions of birds within NSW; and

To record observations which may indicate changes in species numbers, frequency, range and movements

The format maintains the conventions established in the 1985 Report. The Location Guide, at Appendix 2, lists all locations mentioned in the text. This guide is intended to assist readers to better determine the general location of reported observations. The production of future reports will be greatly assisted if observers provide location map references in the manner set out in the Appendix. This is more important these days, particularly if the records are to be used in the Australian Bird Atlas which commenced in August 1998. As all records submitted to the Australian Bird Atlas must contain the exact co-ordinates for

the sites in which the birds were seen, it would help if the same co-ordinates are provided when submitting records to the NSWFOC Records Officer.

Information on 461 species is contained in the 1999 Report. This information was gleaned from about 100+ sources including 361 observers from the NSWFOC, BMBO, CBOC, IBOC, MFNCN, MVBW & COG; the 100+ observers who contributed to the Annual Reports of the Central Coast Group of the FOC, Eurobodalla Natural History Society, Illawarra and Hunter Bird Observers Clubs; publications of other bird organisations and reports and messages from Birding-Aus on the Internet. The number of records and the number of observers continue to increase and the information provided is greater than before. New contributors to this report, who by the year 2000 have become well known birders include Hal Wootton & Stephen Popple. Abbreviations for these organisations are as follows: Aust. Birding = Australian Birding; Birdline = Telephone Info. Line for the NSW bird groups; BMBO = Blue Mountains Bird Observers Newsl; Gang Gang = Newsl. of the Canberra Ornith. Group; CBOC = Cumberland Bird Obs. Club Newsl.; CCBR = Central Coast Group, Birding NSW FOC Annual Report; HBOC = Hunter Bird Obs. Annual Report; HBWN = Hastings Birdwatchers newsl.; IBOC = Illawarra Bird Observers Clu, IBR = Illawarra Bird Report; MFNCN = Murrumbidgee Field Naturalists Club Newsl.; MVB = Manning Valley Birdwatchers; MVBO = Macleay Valley Bird Observers; NSWBA = NSW Bird Atlassers; NSWFOC = NSW Field Ornithologists Club; SOSSA = Southern Ocean Seabird Survey Assoc.; TBN = Tamworth Birdwatchers Nwsl.; TBO = The Bird Observer; Wingspan = Birds Australia Newsl. Other abbreviations used include "A" for adult, "AM" for Adult Male, and "AF" for adult female, "D" for dead or beachcast, "E" for eggs, "GC" for golf course, "HC" for heard calling, "HS" for high school, "Im" immature, "N" for nest, "Pr" for pairs, "RK" for road kill, RP for Regional Park and "RS" for railway station. Cedar Hill Drive Swamp, Minmi, an area well known to birdwatchers in the Hunter Region, had two names changes in 1999, first to Pourmalong Swamp, and then to Pambalong Swamp Nature Reserve, by which name it is referred to in this Report.

A number of unusual or otherwise significant records were received in 1999 with one new species, the Antarctic Petrel seen off Mistral Point, Maroubra on 26 July, being added to the New South Wales List. The colder than usual ocean currents in June & July may well have been the reason for the most Blue Petrel records since 1973 (9 reports of 14 birds in total), many Southern Fulmars, a Sooty Albatross (the first confirmed record since 1985) & a Light-mantled Sooty Albatross. A Pied Heron was observed and photographed at a wetland at Ettamogah near Albury in December, and was accepted as the 2nd record for NSW. There were 8 reports of Grey Falcons, including breeding records for Wanaaring and West Wyalong, being the most records for this species reported in any one year in the NSW Bird Reports. A Roseate Tern in January at Woody Head, Iluka became the 5th confirmed record for NSW while in September and October there was an influx of Black & Pied Honeyeaters in NSW, and again the number of Pied Honeyeaters

reports was the greatest since the Bird Reports commenced in 1970 and at the same time there was also an influx of Pied Honeyeaters into Victoria.

There was no major weather patterns of significance this year although cyclonic rains in southern Queensland and north-eastern NSW in late December 1998 & January 1999 brought flood rains to the Gwydir catchment and subsequent flooding to the Gingham Watercourse in January for the second consectutive year. Colder than usual ocean currents off the NSW coast in June & July would appear to have attracted a number of more southerly occurring seabirds to coastal waters south of Newcastle. Finally I am pleased to report that the number of colonial nesting egrets in the coastal colonies showed an increase, the first time in about 8 years!

The operations of Birds Australia (BARC) and the NSW Ornithological Records Appraisal Committees (NSWORAC) continue to run smoothly and assist the editors of this report in reviewing rare or erroneous records. Their assistance is greatly appreciated because of the level of credibility that is now placed on sightings of an unusual nature.

The scientific and English names used in this report follow that of the RAOU Checklist (Christidis & Boles 1994). For each species, all observations are presented in a set order that follows generally the order of Regions in the State as described by McAllan & Bruce (1988). Observations from coastal regions are listed first from north to south, followed by the tablelands, slopes and plains. Each set of observations is separated from those of other regions by semi-colons. The locations given in Appendix 2 are identified with these regions. However, in order to take account of the five annual bird reports, it is necessary in the text to refer to that section of NSW from Harrington to Lake Macquarie as the "Hunter Region", Gosford & Wyong local government areas as the "Central Coast", the County of Cumberland northwest to St Albans, Upper Colo, Bilpin and west to Springwood as "Sydney Region", the County of Camden and the Shoalhaven Shire as "Illawarra" and Eurobodalla and Bega Shires as "South Coast", as these areas co-incide with the reporting areas of their reports.

Since the preparation of this Report commenced a number of regular contributors have passed away and in particular mention must be made of S.G. (Bill) Lane whose name figures in the first report of 1970 and continues right through to the 1999 Report. Bill died on 4 January 2000 and was a close personal friends of the editor, had a great interest in the distribution of the birds in NSW and hence was a willing contributor to this Report and his contribution will be sorely missed.

Finally a plea for all those people who find dead birds, which are either difficult to identify or unusual. When such specimens are found, seek to have the specimen sent to the Australian Museum for identification. If local wildlife carer groups like WIRES are unable

to assist to have the specimen taken to the Museum, contact your local NPWS office for assistance.

Merrylands 1-13 Jan (ALe), 1 West Head, Kur-ringai Chase NP 19 Jun (TQ); 2 at mound, Mt Keira Track 29 Jul-6 Aug (CC); F Mt Wilson 28-31 May (ERy), 1 Dunns Swamp, Wollemi NP 28 Jun (JSe). Urban records continue to increase.

The Northern Tablelands Region remains important for the species.

Musk Duck Biziura lobata Resident Grahamstown Dam max 15 on 30 Apr & 6 Morpeth STW 20 Jun (HBR); Resident Central Coast at Tuggerah STW & Colongra Lake in small numbers, but also reported from Kincumber STW, Tuggerah Lakes & Tuggerah Lagoon

(CCFOC); 2+1Y Centennial Park 3 Jan (PDb), 1 Kronos Hill Pond, Homebush 20 Mar (JSe), 1 Lane Cove River, Hunters Hill 6 Apr (DH), 2 Cronulla HS Swamp 20 Jun (EV); 1 Mittagong 20 Feb (LG), max 5 Swan Lake 2 May-6 Jun (KM), 15 Killalea Lagoon 13 Jun (DG); 20 Dangars Lagoon, Uralla 29 Dec (JCe); A number of the Sydney & Illawarra sites are new locations for this species.

Black Swan *Cygnus atratus* Reported nesting in the Hunter Region every month of the year (HBR); 12 nesting events reported from the Central Coast throughout the year, highest for 5 years, present all year Tuggerah Lakes max 2628 Jan, of which 1818 were on Budgewoi Lake (CCFOC); 2000+ Lake Wollumboola 23 Jan (CC); 150-200 nesting on Fenton's Swamp, Collie 3 Jul (HJ); 21+ nests Fivebough Swamp 28 Jul, 100+ nests Bulls Run 15 Jul (MS). Average year.

Australian Shelduck Tadorna tadornoides Im McGraths Hill STW 17 Jan (EV); 5 Hoskins NR 22 Feb (RBo), 1 Milton 23 Jun (KM); 2 Goolloinboin HSD, Glen Davis 11 Dec (PDb); 40 Fivebough 17 Oct, low count compared to previous years (KH).

Cotton Pygmy-Goose Nettapu coromandelianus No records reported.

Green Pygmy-Goose N. pulchellus No records reported.

Chestnut Teal A. castanea 700 Ash Island 6 Mar, 600+ Hexham Swamp 15 May & 300 Kooragang Is Mar (HBR), large concentrations for Hunter Valley; 5000+ Lake Wollumboola 24 Jan (CC), a large concentration.

Pink-eared Duck Malacorhynchus membranaceus Present Jabiru Wetlands, Casino Apr-Jun, max 102 on 23 Jun (ABi,JH), 100+ Belmore Swamp 20 May (ARc), 40+ Swan Creek 24 Aug-11 Sep (GC); Reported in the Lower Hunter Valley all year, max numbers 124 Morpeth STW 27 Feb, 67 Ash Island 6 Mar, 50 Tarro Swamps 26 Feb (HBR); Reported on the Central Cost in small numbers 16 Jan-Aug, max 28 Tuggerah (CCFOC); Max 150 Pitt Town Lagoon 16 Jan-16 Apr (ARo,ASt,EV), present Bi-centennial Park Homebush 16 Jan-2 Jul, max 168 on 1 Jul (ARo,EH,JSe,NH), 1 Riverine Park, Arncliffe 3 Mar (RMo); Recorded at 6 sites in the Illawarra 8 Jan-5 Aug, max 40 Windang Peninsula 20 Jun (IBR), first record for this site; 24 Dangars Lagoon Uralla 29 Dec (JCe); 100+ Curlewis STW 10 Jul (AA). More coastal records than usual.

Hardhead Aythya australis 150+ Sportsman Creek 23 Mar-18 May (GC), a large local concentration.

Australasian Little Grebe Tachybaptus novaehollandiae Small numbers feeding in a weed bed on the salt water Tuggerah Lake 6 Jun (CCFOC), unusual location.

Hoary-headed Grebe *Poliocephalus poliocephalus* Present on the Central Coast 10 Apr-28 August, max 10 Colongra Lake 10 Apr, confirming its status as a winter visitor (CCFOC).

Great Crested Grebe *Podiceps cristatus* 15-20 occasionally Walka Water Works 27 Feb-1 May (HBR), smaller numbers at 2 other sites; 3 Lake Illawarra 19 Sep (SKi), 50+ Lake Burragorang 15 Dec (CC); 200+ Lake Wallis, Wallerawang 17 Jan (PDb), 2 Rylstone STW 24 Dec (PR); 1 Gum Swamp, Forbes 4 Oct (ML); 4 Lake Wyangan 23-26 Jan (JDu), 6 Lake Cargelligo 18 Sep (AM).

Little Penguin Eudyptula minor 1 Crescent Head 17 Mar (MVBO) & 1 Crowdy Head 9 Apr (HBR), the 2 most northerly records for the year; 1 Darling Point 10 May (BP), max 5 Berrys Bay, Sydney Harbour 24 Jul-26 Aug (TN), some interesting upper Harbour records.

Common Diving Petrel *Pelecanoides urinatrix* 1 off Long Reef 6 Aug, 1 on 19-20 Oct (MR), 1 beachcast Cronulla Beach 28 Aug (DH); 2 off Eden 16 May (GCl). More records than usual and consistent with known distribution, 30-33rd records for NSW.

Southern Giant-Petrel Macronectes giganteus Present offshore South West Rocks to Grassy Head 17 Mar-25 Sep, max 2 (KS,JMe,LMc); Present off Norah Head 3 Jul, 1 beachcast Umina Beach 15 Jul (CCFOC); Max 24, including 2 white morph off Mistral Pt/ Magic Pt Maroubra 23 Jun-28 Nov (RG), 2 Long Reef 10 Jul (EV) & 2 white morphs on 15 Aug (MR), 2 off Sydney 7 Aug & 1 on 14 Aug (AP); Present off Wollongong 27 Jun-20 Oct, max 8 on 25 Jul (ASt,PM), 3 white morphs Point Perpendicular 12 Sep (MR), 6 inshore off Sandon Point 8 Aug (JB); Present off Eden 20 Jun-19 Sep, max 9 on 19 Sep (BJ,EA).

Northern Giant-Petrel *M. halli* 1 on Continental Shelf off Grassy Head 24 Aug (LMc); Present off Magic Pt/Mistral Pt Maroubra 8 Jun-15 Aug, max 18 on 15 Jul (DMe,EV,RG), 2 off Sydney 7 & 14 Aug (AP); Present of Wollongong 3 Jul-22 Aug, max 4 on 25 Jul (PM); Present off Eden 20 Jun-19 Sep, max 4 on 15 Aug (BJ,EA). More records than usual, possibly there is an upwards trend.

Southern Fulmar Fulmarus glacialoidies 1 off Norah Head 27 Jul, 1st Central Coast record in 27 years (CCFOC); 1 off Sydney 29 Jun (SAs), 1 off Long Reef 24 Jun-31 Aug (MR), 1 off Magic Pt Maroubra 14 Jun-13 Sep (RG); 1 Austimer 9 Jul (TWy), 1 off Wollongong 10 Jul, 17 Jul, 19 Sep (ASt,PM), 1 Bass Point Wollongong 15 Aug (GB), 1 Pt Perpendicular 12 Sep (MR); 2 off Batemans Bay 8 Aug (PM), 1 off Eden 19 Sep (EA), 2 beachcast Haycock Rock, Merimbula 18 Nov (LS). A mimimum of 14 records along the entire southern coastline of NSW 14 Jun-18 Nov, this is without precedent and an extraordinary situation for a bird rarely reported in NSW.

Antarctic Petrel *Thalassoica antarctica* 1 observed off Magic Pt Maroubra 26 Aug (RG), accepted by BARC, first NSW record and first submission for this species for the Australian mainland..

Cape Petrel Daption capense australe Present off South West Rocks to Grassy Head 4 Jul-25 Sep, max 40 on 4 Jul (KS,LMc); 1 off Port Stephens 8 Oct (HBR); 1 off Norah Head 28 Aug, first Central Coast record (CCFOC); Present off Magic Pt Maroubra 26 Jun-18 Nov, max 150+ 15 Jul & 36 on 24 Oct (DMe,RG), max 30 off Long Reef 1 Jun-2 Jul, 2 on 12 Oct (MR), present off Sydney 7 Jul-13 Nov, max 25-30 on 9 Oct (AP); Present off Wollongong 27 Jun-20 Oct, max 150+ on 21 Aug (ASt, PM); Present off Eden 20 Jun-21 Nov max 17 on 17 Oct (BJ,EA), 6 off Tollgate Islands 6 Oct (ENHS). 2 of the race D. c. capense reported off Wollongong 10 Jul (PM). These are exceptional numbers for NSW.

Kerguelen Petrel Lugensa brevirostris 1 off Sydney 29 Jun (SAs), 1 off Long Reef 13 Jul (MR), 1 off Magic Pt Maroubra 24 Oct (RG); 1 off Wollongong 27 Jun (AP) & 2 on 19 Jul (PM). More records than usual.

Tahiti Petrel *Pseudobulweria rostrata* 4 seen 17 n.m. ENE North Solitary Island 21 Jan (NCh), 24th record, only report received.

Fairy Martin *H. aerial* Overwintering at Woodford Island 22 May (GC); 7 Italian Mine Road 6-16 Jun, early arrivals or over-wintering? (ENHS). Arrival: 22 Fivebough Swamp 22 May (KH), 15+ Popran Quarry 13 Jul (CCBR), 6 Bicentennial Park 30 Jul (TD), 10+ Fineflower 21 Aug (GC).

Red-whiskered Bulbul *Pycnonnotus jocosus* 2 South West Rocks 6 Jun (PRa); 14 Lake Wollumboola 3 Apr (APa), most southern limit; 1 Lake George 13 Feb (Nix 1999), new location, Canberra beware!!

Clamorous Reedwarbler Acrocephalus stentoreus 2 Fivebough Swamp 22 Aug (KH), early date.

Tawny Grassbird Megalurus timoriensis 11 Salt Ash 6 Mar & 14 on 20 Nov (HBR); 1 North Tacoma 15 Aug, new Central Coast location (CCBR); 1 Magic Pt Maroubra 14 Mar-8 Sep (EV,RG), 1 Bushells Lagoon 5 Jul (BC), 1 Pitt Town Bottoms 18 Dec (KB), 2 Pipeclay Pt Narrabeen Lagoon 30 Nov-20 Dec (BC).

Rufous Songlark Cinclorhamphus mathewsi 1 Cornwallis Rd Richmond 2 Oct (EV); 2 Megalong Valley 21 Nov (EV), edge of range. Arrival: 1 Capertee Valley 14 Aug (PDb).

Brown Songlark C. cruralis 2 Cornwallis Rd Richmond 2 Oct (EV), the only coastal record received.

Golden-headed Cisticola Cisticola exilis 50+ Broughton Is Jan (HBR); 1 Talbingo 4 Mar (IH, WEm).

Bassian Thrush *Zoothera lunulata* Resident across the Central Coast in suitable habitat, reported from 5 sites during the period Apr-Nov (CCBR).

Powerful Owl Ninox strenua Immature injured on road near Manilla (Debus 2001).

Barking Owl *Ninox connivens* Reported from Grove Rd Tingha, at Etoo Creek & Cumbil CK, Cumbil SF, and at Boorolong Ck, Armidale (Debus 2001).

Masked Owl Tyto novaehollandiae Reported from Baradine Ck, Merriwindi SF and possible response from playback at Warrabadah NP (Debus 2000).

Pied Honeyeater Certhionyx variegatus Present at Lake Pinnaroo, Camerons Corner Rd & Olive Downs, Sturt NP 24-28 Oct (SHo).

Red-lored Whistler *Pachycephala rufogularis* Reported at Round Hill Nature Reserve on 9 Oct (SHa) and again on 1 Nov (DTa), URRF's submitted and accepted by Aust. Bird Atlas. No records for Round Hill since these dates.

Cape Petrel Daption capense 1 seen on 9 Oct (DH), rare visitor.

Great-winged Petrel Pterodroma macroptera 10 around Balls Pyramid 3 Sep (RCe).

Kermadec Petrel Pterodroma neglecta 10 around Balls Pyramid 4 Feb (PMa), 30 (1 light morph, 2 intermediate morphs the remainder all dark) same place 3 Sep (RCe), 5 including light, intermediate & dark morphs between Ball's Pyramid & the mainland 9 Oct & 4 on 27 Oct (DH,ML).

Black-winged Petrel *Pterodroma nigripennis* 3 Neds Beach 3 Nov, first summer record, slightly earlier than given by Hutton (1991).

Little Shearwater Puffinus affinis 3 around Balls Pyramid 3 Sep (RCe).

Sooty Shearwater Puffinus griseus 3 seen off Balls Pyramid 9 & 10 Oct (DH).

Short-tailed Shearwater *Puffinus tenuirostris* 30 off Balls Pyramid 9 Oct and 100+ on 10 Oct (DH).

Hutton's Shearwater *Puffinus huttoni* Single bird seen on both 9 & 10 Oct near Balls Pyramid (DH).

Wandering Alabtross Diomedea exulans gibsoni A stage 3 bird on 9 Oct, 6 n.m. E of Mount Gower & 1 seen from Blinkey Beach 30 Oct (DH,ML), first records since before 1945 (Hutton 1991).

Black-browed Albatross *D. m. melanophris* Immature near Balls Pyramid 10 Oct & another on 27 Oct (ML), not listed by Hutton (1991), although recently claimed by others, no reports published 1990-1998 in NSW Bird Reports.

White-bellied Storm-Petrel Fregretta grallaria Max 8 on 4 Feb (PMa), 3 on 3 Sep (RCe), 60+ seen between mainland and Balls Pyramid on 27 Oct (ML), including at least one totally black-bellied bird (with a normal white rump), and a couple of intermediate phase birds (which has a little bit of white on the belly and a less distinct white rump).

Great Cormorant Phalacrocorax carbo 1 off Kings Beach 22 Nov (JG).

Australasian Gannet Morus serrator Sub-adult close to shore near Little Island 5 Feb (PM), Immature seen inside lagoon 10 Oct (DH), an uncommon visitor.

Intermediate Egret Egretta intermedia 1 in breeding plumage Milky Way units 26 Nov (JG).

Eurasian Coot Fulica atra 1 seen 8-15 Mar (IH), rare vagrant.

Ruddy Turnstone Arenaria interpres Flock of 80 at Old Settlement Beach 24 Nov (JG).

Wandering Tattler Heteroscelus incana 2 Neds Beach 7 Oct (DH)

Grey-tailed Tattler H. brevipes Max 4 seen around Island 3-5 Feb (PMa).

Red Knot Callidris canutus 1 seen on beach at end of Airstrip 8 Oct (DH), rare visitor.

Double-banded Plover *Charadrius bicinctus* 1 Old Settlement Beach 23 Nov, 1 North Bay 27-28 Nov, in non-breeding plumage (JG), late date.

Lesser Sand Plover Charadrius mongolus 1 on 8-15 Mar (IH) & 1 Blinkey Beach 28 Nov (ML), rare visitor.

Little Tern Sterna albifrons Bird in winter plumage with band but the number could not be read 7 Oct (DH), rare visitor.

White Tern Gygis alba Estimated 100 pairs around settlement in 1999, cf 10 pairs in 1972 (Recher et al 1974).

Black Noddy *Anous minutus* 40 nests in trees behind North Bay Beach 29 Oct (ML), cf 1972 surveys when no breeding could be discerned (Recher et al 1974).

Masked Owl Tyto novaehollandiae I responded to tape on golf course but not seen 4 Feb (PMa).

European Starling Sturna vulgaris 1 Malabar Track Feb (PM), 2-4 seen around Settlement Beach 5-10 Oct (DH), only recorded at Milky Way units 21-28 Nov (JG). First reported 1924, estimated to be about fifty birds 1990, but a gradual decline has a been noted in recent times (Hutton 1991).

RARE BIRDS IN NEW SOUTH WALES IN 1999 NINTH REPORT OF THE NSW ORNITHOLOGICAL RECORDS APPRAISAL COMMITTEE

The ninth report of the NSWORAC details 18 submissions considered by the Committee as well as two submission dealt with by the Birds Australia Records Committee (BARC) relating to records in NSW. Together with the 245 cases already dealt with previously (Brandwood 2001) this brings to 263 the total number of cases resolved. Of the 245 cases considered, 164 have been accepted, 53 not accepted and 46 not confirmed. As at 31 December 2001, 324 submissions have been received.

The objective of the Committee is to provide an informed, discerning and impartial appraisal of claimed records of birds rare in NSW and Lord Howe Island. The membership of the Committee for 1999 was R. Cooper (Chairperson), K. Brandwood (Secretary), D. Hobcroft, A. Lindsey, A. K. Morris, A. Palliser, R. Turner & A.E.F. Rogers.

The Review List was adjusted from 1 January 1999 to remove Black-winged Petrel & Common Noddy. These species were removed because in the ten years up to 1999, each species was generally recorded annually often with multiple sightings. The current Review List was re-published in the newsletters of the contributing bird groups in NSW during the year 2001.

During the winter of 1999 there were some very cold ocean currents reported from the NSW coast and these colder than usual seas attracted extraordinary numbers of Southern Fulmars, Blue Petrels and other southern ocean seabirds.

The Committee continued to work closely with Birds Australia Rarities Committee (BARC), and two submission relating to reports received in 1999 for species on their Review List were referred directly. One determination was subsequently been received and was accepted (The Antarctic Petrel, 1st record for the Australian Mainland) and the other not accepted.

The quality of submissions continues to improve which is indeed encouraging. Many of the difficulties faced by the Committee from submissions result from very brief notes taken from memory. It is re-iterated that the recording of rarities such as those on the Review List will require as a minimum one or more of the following:

Field notes as comprehensive as possible; Photographs and or tape recordings; Reports from multiple persons; The completion of a RAC report form.

A full report of each decision of the NSWORAC is available from the Secretary.

The format of this report is similar to previous reports. Again those records "not accepted" (NA), and those records "not confirmed" (NC) will be listed at the end of the Report. Records "not confirmed" are those where two years or more have elapsed without a submission being received even though invited by the Secretary. The Committee would welcome further information on any record not accepted or not confirmed and is willing to re-open to consider data additional to that already available.

Following the name of species accepted, there will be a set of three numerals. The first is the number of confirmed records for the species in NSW, the second is the number of confirmed records since 1970 (when the NSWFOC Annual Reports commenced), and the third represents the number of that species recorded in 1999. English and scientific names used in the text are in accordance with Christidis & Boles (1994).

Those observers who record the first, second or third records for NSW are encouraged to publish details in an appropriate journal.

Some people will feel disappointed at having their records not accepted but at the same time do understand that it is a worthwhile exercise to have the same standard of review applied to all records of rare or unusual species. Cases listed as "not confirmed" or "not accepted" do not necessarily reflect mis-identification, rather that information to date is inadequate to confirm identity beyond reasonable doubt. The support of all people in the review system is appreciated.

SYSTEMATIC LIST OF CASES ACCEPTED

Southern Fulmar Fulmarus glacialoides 33.31.13

During 1999 a minimum number of 13 Southern Fulmars were observed at 11 locations along the coast of NSW, from Norah Head in the north to Eden in the south (Morris 2002) Possibly 20-25 individual birds were seen between 24 June to 18 November. This irruption was without precedent and was an extraordinary situation for a bird rarely reported in NSW. From all these records three submissions were received however the same observers were often involved in seeing other Southern Fulmars birds and the Committee did not think it necessary to obtain more submissions when it was obvious that these birds were being seen regularly. At the time there was a cold water current off the NSW coast and it is believed that this is the reason for this and rare other species being present. The times of occurrence are consistent with previous records June-December.

Case No 298 details the sighting of a Southern Fulmar off Wollongong on 10 July 1999. This bird was caught and banded leaving no doubt as to the identity of the species and all identifying features were noted. Notes taken at the time described the petrel-shaped bill, pinkish coloured with black tip, silver grey upper wings with black primaries with white flashes giving a white shaft effect (in actual fact the primaries are all white with black tips leading onto the secondaries). There was a dark trailing edge to the wing. Primary coverts were dark grey contrasting with the white bases of the primaries giving that distinctive black and white finger effect on the upper wings seen when flying.

Case No 302 details the sighting of this species from land off Magic Point Maroubra on 31 July 1999. Seen at a distance of approx 2 km for 5-10 minutes by three observers, this distinctively plumaged bird was not difficult to identify even at that distance and a good description was provided.

Case No 325 details the sighting of this species 17 nautical miles east of Eden on 19 September 1999 at a distance of 10 metres for a period of 25 minutes by many observers, the bird was photographed as well. During this time all the distinctive features of this species were noted and can be seen in the photograph of the bird which appears on the b cover of the Journal.

Antarctic Petrel Thalassoica antarctica 1.1.1

Case 327 was submitted to BARC as their case No 277. This bird was seen from land at Mistral Point, Maroubra on 26 July 1999 by a lone observer who spends many hours each day seawatching from this locality. The bird was described as similar in size to a Cape Petrel *Daption capensis*, the dorsal surface was seen well, being pied, black (or blackish) and white. The head, mantle and back all appeared blackish as did the forepart of the upperwings. An obvious broad white stripe ran along the rear part of wings. The tail was also white with a hint of a dark tip, underparts not clearly seen but appeared to be white except for the head. The distinctive black and white plumage sets it apart from all other species in Australian Waters. First record for the Australian mainland and 1st record for NSW.

Soft-plumaged Petrel Pteradroma mollis

Case No 297 details the observation of this gadfly petrel species at sea 25 km east of Wollongong on 10 July 1999 at a distance of 20-30 metres. The bird was seen on two occasions for a total period of seven minutes giving excellent views to multiple observers. Notes taken at that time of observation showed that the bird had grey upper parts, breast band and underwing; the remainder of the underparts white, this combination separates the species from all other gadfly petrels. 6th confirmed record for NSW, the previous records all July-October.

Blue Petrel Halobaena caerula 15.6.2 (11)

Case No 293 details the second live observation at sea of a Blue Petrel in NSW, and which was seen off Sydney on 10 July 1999. The bird was observed by multiple observers for 15 minutes at a distance as close as five metres. The observer supplied six slides, sketches and brief notes detailing the conspicuous white tip to the end of the tail, the dark hood and collar, a dark "M" mark across the pale blue grey upper wings on a prion size bird, the white tail tip being diagnostic for the species. Subsequently 18 birds were seen at five locations from Long Reef south to Batemans Bay from 9 July to 12 September, being about 11 separate records. Consistent with previous records, all seen during July, first records since 1995.

Royal Albatross Diomedea epomophora 34.32.2

Case No 301 details a Royal Albatross of the race *sandfordi*, seen from land off Magic Point Maroubra on 31 July 1999. The bird was seen at an approximate distance of one kilometre for 5-10 minutes in sunny conditions. The observer provided a sketch and notes which detailed the plumage and size, noting the important dark broad mark on the carpal joint that identifies this race of the Royal Albatross.

Case No 294 describes another Southern Royal Albatross *D.e. sandfordi* seen off Wollongong on 22 September 1999 at a distance of 20 m by multiple observers. Brief notes and sketches were provided by the observer, photographic slides were taken at the time but were not provided to the Committee as they had been given to another organisation. The notes and sketches detailed the dark cutting edge of the bill, the all white upper body and all dark upper wings which are the diagnostic features for this race of the Royal Albatross. These records are consistent with the known occurrence from July-November.

Grey-headed Albatross D. chrysostoma 21.6.2

Case No 292 details the observation of a juvenile of this species off Wollongong on 27 June 1999, the bird being observed for 15-20 minutes by many experienced observers at a distance of ten metres. The submission included 6 photographic slides, notes and sketches detailing and showing the critical identifying features including the dark bill with a hint of yellow on top and a very dark blackish tip. Obvious white cheek patches, a very dark eye with a dark patch in front of the eye, greyish head, nape and mantle, that separates this species from a juvenile Black-browed Albatross *D. melanophris*

Case No 323 reports on a sighting of this species in great detail, the observer providing a series of slides confirming the identity. The bird was observed off Eden on 19 September 1999 at a distance of 20 m for a period of two minutes by multiple observers. The description provided fits a First Year/Second Year bird. The only other mollymawk species this could be confused with is the juvenile Black-browed Albatross and the notes and photographs submitted eliminate this species. Both observations are consistent with know occurrence being May-December with most records for July-August.

Sooty Albatross Phoebetria fusca 16.12.1

Case No 296 details the observation at sea off Wollongong on 3 July 1999 at a distance of 50-100 m for two-three minutes of a Sooty Albatross. Notes taken at the time of the observation together with a photograph, describe and show an all dark albatross with a long tail, a slim streamlined body and long pointed wings. The bill was all dark with a yellow sulcus, identifying the bird as a Sooty Albatross. There are very few records of this species seen alive at sea in NSW, most records relate to beachcast specimens. This is

the first record accepted by the NSWORAC for this species and the first confirmed record since 1985 (off Wollongong). The observation is consistent with known occurrence of May-November with most records June-August.

Light-mantled Sooty Albatross *Phoebetria palpebrata* 13.13.1

Case No 295 details the sighting of this species off Wollongong on 27 June 1999 at a distance of 20 m for a period of ten minutes. No notes were taken but six excellent photographs were provided which were supplied with the submission. The photograph shows the light coloured back on an otherwise dark (brown) plumaged albatross, a dark bill with a blue sulcus, identifying this bird as a Light-mantled Sooty Albatross. This is the first record since 1994 and is consistent with previous observations which have occurred from June to October.

Black-bellied Storm-Petrel Fregetta tropica 11.11.2

Case No 299 details the sighting of this species off Wollongong on 10 July 1999 at a distance of four metres, the bird leaving and returning to the boat on four occasions over a period of about one hour giving good views to multiple observers. The observer supplied notes on plumage and size, which mentioned the all black upper parts with white crescent shaped rump The neck and breast down to upper belly, was the same dark colour as the uppers. There was a black line running down the belly to where the legs attach, remainder of underparts white. Typical description for the species, last reported 1996.

Case No 305 details the sighting of this species at sea off Sydney on 25 September 1999 at a distance of 50 m. There were 25 other people present who saw the bird and a number of photographs were taken and submitted with the submission. The description included details of a blotchy patchy black belly line, feet just trailing beyond the tail, white rump, white flanks, blotchy white under the wing, otherwise black all over. Second confirmed record since 1996, all consistent with known occurrence, most records September to February.

Pied Heron Ardea picta 2.2.1

Case No 321 was comprised of a report and photographs of this distinctive bird published in *The Bird Observer* (Herring 2000). The bird, an adult, was observed on a large irrigation dam at Ettamogha near Albury on 17-18 August 1999 and all the distinctive features can be seen. A photograph of this bird appears on the front cover of the Journal. The only previous confirmed record was one at Lake Cowal in 1977.

Roseate Tern Sterna dougalii 4.4.1

Case No 306 details the sighting of this species on 24 January 1999 at Woody Head in Bunjalung National Park. The bird was roosting with 250 Common Terns S. hirundo, 5 Little Terns S. albifrons, 1 juvenile White-winged Black-Tern Chilidonias leucopterus, 2

Common Noddies *Anous stolidus* and 10 Silver Gulls *Larus novaehollandiae* giving plenty of species for comparison. The bird was observed for 30 minutes at a distance of 25 m and its rosy pink underparts, finer bill, different head shape and head markings giving the bird a different facial expression and setting it apart from the Common Terns. This is the first confirmed record since 1976 and one of the previous records was also in January.

White-chinned Petrel *Procellaria aequinostialis* 1 at sea off Wollongong 11 September & 11 December, 1 off Lake Wollumboola 5 December 1999 (Morris 2002). NC.

Light-mantled Sooty Albatross *Phoebetria palpebrata* 1 at sea off Sydney 29 June 1999 (Morris 2002). NC.

Grey-backed Storm-Petrel *Oceanites nereis* 1 at sea off Wollongong 3 July, 14 August, two off Eden 15 August 1999 (Morris 2002). NC.

Black-bellied Storm-Petrel Fregetta tropica 1 at sea off Wollongong 20 October & 27 December 1999 (Morris 2000).NC.

Masked Booby Sula novaehollandiae 2 juveniles off Ballina Apr, 1 off South West Rocks 19 November & 16 December 1999 (Morris 2002). NC.

Red-footed Bobby Sula sula 1 at Long Reef5 June 1999 (Morris 2002). NC.

Buff-breasted Sandpiper *Tringites subruficollis* 1 Lake Wollumboola 21 March 1999, no submission made to BARC. (Morris 2002). NC.

South Polar Skua Catharacta maccormicki 1 at sea off Wollongong 31 July 1999 (Morris 2002). NC.

Blue-winged Kookaburra *Dacelo leachii.* Single bird reported from Sturt NP 10 September 1999 (Morris 2002). Case No 304. NC.

Glossy Swiftlet Collocalia esculenta. Two small swifts seen at Connells point, Sydney 145 March 1999 (Morris 2002). BARC Case No 261. NA.

Pink Robin Petrioca rodinogaster Single brown bird reported from Mitchell park, Cattai 11 April 1999 (Morris 2002). Case No 303. NA
